Senate Bill 48	Micheline provided information regarding the passage of the amended	Micheline G. Miglis
(informational, 30 minutes)	Senate Bill 48 and referred everyone to handouts, SB48 already in	
	existence, reviewed initial SB48 stipulations/laws, advised/reviewed	
	amended laws, SB48 passed and goes into effect Jan. 2012	
	Diana S. – are we getting new books?	
	Answer-no, when we do the next adoption the new stipulations will be	
	applied to the new materials, the state left it up to the LEA's to decide	
	for now, we will not be making any changes in Jan. but be aware of	
	upcoming changes,	
	Diana S. – how are they going to monitor and check?	
	Answer – one way would be by parent complaint, because "it is" or	
	because "it is not" happening, we need to be very careful and figure this	
	out as we go, based on the SBCSS meeting we will need to use	
	supplementary curriculum if it is not in our current curriculum, this will	
	need to be figured out slowly, this bill requires instruction in social	
	sciences to also include a study of the role and contributions of Native	
	American, African American, Mexican American, Asian American,	

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	 Pacific Islanders, European American, lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender Americans, persons with disabilities, and other ethnic and cultural groups. Reviewed and discussed FAQ from CDE (handout) What exactly are the changes introduced by this new legislation? Does the law prohibit discrimination based on sexual orientation? When does the law take effect? Jan. 2012 What new instruction is required to be taught by this law? At which grade levels does this content have to be taught? Does this law change the CA history – social science standards? When can we expect textbooks that include the content required by the legislations? How should school districts address questions and concerns from parents and other members of the community about this legislation?

	Referred group to the handout regarding SVHS Blueprint Assessment,	
	Cameron spoke about ELA first, showed growth above the 50% mark,	
	trend continued through all grades 9-11, different with math,	
	Introduction to Math agreed to administer the General Math test, no	
	comparative scores as test was not taken in Sept.	
	Micheline – pointed out that students did better on the Algebra Cluster	
	on the General Math test which is a great sign of things working! Renee R. mentioned that most of the items on the Algebra 1 test does	
	not get covered/taught in the class until later in the year and this maybe	
	reflective,	
	Micheline pointed out that the November data does not reflect the same	
	menenne pointed out that the november data does not reneet the same	

number of students that took test in September.	
Cameron – reviewed the Science and Social Science growth	
Micheline pointed out that there is a pattern of growth; Are where we	
need to be, what are the next steps for teachers and how are we moving	
through the materials?	
Diana S. questioned how much time is being spent teaching/instructing,	
Cameron confirms that they are consistent unless the students are in a	
support class, plans to meet with teachers, break down information	
more and move through the data, and then re-meet with teachers in	
January after they had further time to review,	
Micheline talked about "what do we do now with the info we have", now	
is the time address issues before it gets away from us,	
Cameron - states they need make changes now before the next testing is	
done,	
Diana S. – curious as to what the 8 th grade looks like	
Cameron – stated the 9 th grade seems better prepared now than in the	
past, per teacher conversations at the site, they will sit down and look at	
the data in more depth,	
Micheline – feels we are more engaged this year with the district	
assessments	
Cameron – touched on summative test results and will share more later,	
Micheline questioned if it is possible that teachers get the test, give it	
and then forget about it until it's time to give it again because it is a	
district test? The problem is that the test is based on the district data,	
informed group that the board is very concerned with math results,	
Cameron – making arrangements for more coaching for HOLT, there is	
someone working currently through CMAT with teachers, model	
lessons, and good relationship.	
Micheline stated that we are rethinking coaching options, board is	
vocal that we do this, move on it,	
Cyndy G is this for high school only or will this move into the middle	
school as well?	
Micheline explained that it has not been that aggressive but is moving	
that way	
Cameron – does not want teachers to feel beaten by this and that he's	
there to support them, board is at a point now where they are done with	
past rationale and they want to see changes,	
Micheline informed that the board just returned from meeting with	

	state and heard about other districts making improvements, want to see improvements now, no more programs, concerns about math, we need	
	to "rev" up the math programs, Cameron – we know our students can learn we just need to figure the	
	right "mix" or "method" that is needed to help the students "click/learn",	
	Micheline - there's value in the assessment, understanding the assessment may not be happening,	
	Cameron – mentioned the master schedule was changed, will be reviewing in January with staff, master schedule plays a large part in	
	what is offered to students, confirms that the master schedule needs to	
	begin in January and that's why discussions start now, mentioned again that he is proud of his staff and encourage those present	
	Micheline asked for any more thoughts/questions.
