Standard Operating Procedures

All schools will be under the Traditional Food based Menu Planning/Offer vs Serve at Breakfast. Silver Valley High, Calico High, Ft. Irwin Middle, and Silver Valley Intermediate Schools will be under the Traditional Food Based Menu Planning/Offer vs. Serve provision with extra fruit, vegetable, and bread options at Lunch. Students at these sites must be offered all five of the components but may select as few (but NO LESS) than three (3) of the meal components.

Lewis Elementary, Yermo Elementary, Newberry Elementary, Tiefert View Intermediate, and the Community Schools are under the “Traditional Food Based Meal Program” and must receive all the components offered at lunch.

Minimum portion serving sizes for lunch will be as follows:

Component	Elementary	Middle/High School Offered
Meat or Meat Alternate	2 oz.	2 oz.
Vegetables	¾ cup per day	1 cup per day
Fruit	½ cup per day	1 cup per day
Bread or Bread Alternate	8 –9 per week	10-12 per week
Milk	½ pint	½ pint

All Schools will utilize ½ pint low fat (1%) milk and/or non-fat chocolate milk as the primary lunch milk.

The Pre-payment of meals is accepted daily at each cafeteria. Every student is assigned an account number and any dollar amount may be deposited on this account.

The District is not geared to keep up with the charging of lunches. If a full pay student does not have money for lunch, up to four days will be charged to their account. Starting on the fifth day, the student **will not** be allowed to charge a meal until their account has been cleared. All eligible students will continue to receive reimbursable meals.

Adult lunches are available at all schools. They consist of one (1) entrée, sides, and milk. Pre-payment of adult meals are not available at this time.

**Adults cannot be sold a student meal. It is against N.S.L.P. codes.**

Adult Lunch (all schools)	\$3.75	\$2.50
