- SLAVE CODES
- Virginia
- It was a crime for slaves to travel across ferries or bridges without their owners' consent in writing.
- Slaves were prohibited from raising their hand to a white person, even in cases of self defense.
- South Carolina
- Slave homes were to be searched every two weeks for weapons or stolen goods.
- Any slave attempting to run away and leave the state received the death penalty.
- No slave could be taught to write.
